**Position Title:** Assistant Professor, Beef Cattle Nutrition

**Location:** University of Idaho, Moscow, Idaho

**Description:** The position is a 12-month, tenure track position in the Animal and Veterinary Science Department, University of Idaho, Moscow. Responsibilities are .60 FTE research and scholarly activity .40 FTE teaching/advising. Teaching responsibilities include: 1) primary instructor for a senior-level beef management course (3 credits), 2) co-instructor (50 percent) of a junior-level applied nutrition course (3 credits), 3) developing a graduate-level nutrition or growth course, and 4) participation in miscellaneous undergraduate and graduate courses. Advising duties will include academic advising undergraduate students and serving as major professor and committee member of graduate students. Participation in student extracurricular activities is also expected. Research responsibilities include leading a nationally recognized applied beef nutrition program. The research program must also be integral to other research programs in the Animal and Veterinary Science Department and the College of Agricultural and Life Sciences; these programs would include, but would not necessarily be limited to, programs involving growth physiology, meat science, forage alternatives, and cellular and molecular basis for bovine reproduction, and other biological events. The research program must be highly relevant to the cow/calf and/or feedlot industries at the state and national levels and will be capable of attracting external funding from the full spectrum of federal and industry sources. Service to the animal science profession and all administrative levels of the University of Idaho is expected.



**Required qualifications:**

- Ph.D. in Animal Science or related field with emphasis in beef cattle nutrition
- Proven interest and understanding of beef cattle production in the US
- Demonstrated ability to generate and publish novel research in the area of beef cattle nutrition
- Demonstrated ability to teach the required courses

**Preferred qualification:**

- Relevant post-doctoral experience in academia or industry
- Demonstrated success with writing and submitting grants for external funding

**Salary and Benefits:** Commensurate with qualifications and experience. Benefits include university holidays, medical and life insurance, retirement programs and annual leave.
